WALSH SHIELD GUIDELINES

To be competed for annually by TRC members over two or three days of racing as stated by the committee.

To be raced in Coxed Quad Sculls or Coxed Fours.

Crews to consist of names drawn from a hat by a selected member.

Strokes of each crew to toss a coin for the draw of: 1) Boat, 2) Side of river i.e. North or South.

The course shall be from the Saint Peters College Boatshed corner, to the City Bridge.

Points to be awarded as such:

- a) 1 point for each entered oarsperson,
- b) 2 points for each heat, semi and final to members of winning crews.

In the event of a dead heat between 2 members, a deciding race will be rowed. The 2 members will be in separate boats and 2 new crews selected by a drawing of names.

The highest total of points over the two/three days of racing will be declared the winner of the WALSH SHIELD for the season, and will be presented with their prize at the Annual Dinner.

The preceding information on the running of the Walsh Shield, a traditional intra-club regatta held annually is not part of the club's constitution or part of the club's by-laws in any way, but has been formalised to ensure that this part of the club's tradition remains strong for years to come.
